These are some of the questions whose answers can be found in the Philadelphia Jewish Archives collection housed at Temple University's Paley Library.

Come to our **November 10, 2016** meeting to hear Jessica Lydon, archivist for the collection, use a power point presentation to introduce us to the very rich contents of the Archives which preserves the history of the Philadelphia and South Jersey Jewish communities, from the early 1800's to the present. These include ship's records, personal papers, correspondence, a large photo collection, minutes from organizations, (including NCJW) hospital, synagogue, business records and much, much more. President's Message

We live in very fractured and polarized times both in our own country and around the world. Our congressional representatives no longer seem to talk across the aisles, and appear more bent on planning for the next election than doing the job for which we elected them.

Frighteningly, we see the clock turning back on reproductive justice and women's access to health care – especially for poor women. Many states across our country no longer have any women's health clinics to provide reproductive and other health care for women or only one clinic that is difficult to access for those who are poor. Across our country and, yes in our own state, more and more repressive anti-abortion laws are being passed or introduced that can criminalize doctors and make it more and more difficult for women who are in need of an abortion. Judaism has been pro choice for over a 1,000 years and we can look back into the Talmud to find that this is true. Are we going back to the time of back alley abortions and the “hanger”? The laws limiting women's reproductive rights are undermining Roe v Wade and I fear that the outcome of the upcoming election could lead to Supreme Court appointees who might overturn it completely.

The future well-being of individuals, families, and communities hang in the balance in this upcoming election. Many, right here in our country, go hungry every day. While gun violence is rampant across our country, our national and state legislatures have largely failed to do anything to strengthen background checks or to ban assault weapons. Thousands of people risk losing their health insurance if affordable care is thrown out the window rather than reformed. Entitlement programs such as Social Security are under threat of being weakened by privatization or means testing. The historic 1965 Voting Rights Act is under assault by states passing restrictive voter ID laws, limiting early voting and the number of polling places. Such restrictions make it difficult for many citizens, especially minorities and the poor, to have access to vote. The divisive rhetoric in this election cycle threatens the fabric of our democracy. The number of people facing hunger daily in our country is astonishing.

Therefore stepping up to advocate for social justice with our votes and our ongoing service becomes more important than ever. Thank goodness for organizations like the National Council of Jewish Women. We can all feel very fortunate to have the very capable and dedicated efforts of our Legislative Advocates, LINDA LEMPERS and LYNNE JACOBS who keep us informed of vital legislation and represent us with partnering advocacy groups in pursuit of outcomes that will benefit those we serve.

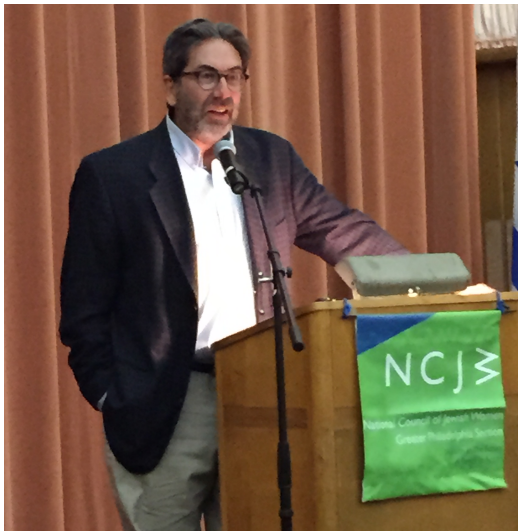
