

DOING THE RIGHT THING

As guest columnist for the JEWISH CHRONICLE, NCJW CEO Nancy Kaufman addressed the pending plight of "nearly 800,000 kids" who five years ago had been "given a reprieve from deportation from DACA" (Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals). These young people face imminent peril as ten State Attorneys General have together threatened President Trump with a lawsuit if he does not, by Sept.5, rescind the policy still protecting them from deportation. As Nancy notes, these are children and young adults who became assimilated in our communities and have little or no memories of their countries of origin. Some face the prospect of separation from their siblings born here.

Nancy Kaufman's most compelling case is the moral one: "As Jews, we are taught in our ancient texts to welcome the stranger; and from our history we know what it feels like to be expelled from one's homeland."

She concludes her writing with exhorting us to "push back against xenophobia and racism that too often cloud the making of immigration policy." As Nancy Kaufman says, "it's the right thing to do.






