SOCIAL JUSTICE FOR VICTIMS
OF SEX-TRAFFICKING

ACTION ALERT; We are looking for NCJW MEMBERS from Montgomery and Bucks Counties to go to Harrisburg to support victims of sex trafficking on Tuesday, December 5. Our NCJW Section has worked for 2 plus years for the passage of SB544, The Safe Harbor Bill in the State House of Representatives. This bill was unanimously passed in the State Senate. It would prohibit the prosecution of victims for charges of prostitution and mandate services for the victims of sex-trafficking. A large presence of advocates making visits to legislators' offices and dropping off information can send a strong message of urgency. There will be a press conference at 10:00 AM with speakers from various religious organizations. - We have now seen the results of our advocacy work in the recent election on November 7th.

Just as we understand the power of the Hanukkah story and the ability of the small to overcome the mighty, our work will continue and we will do even more. NCJW Greater Philadelphia Section Invests in Children

NCJW members attending the October 24 Membership Luncheon raised \$1000 for our adopted Philadelphia School, the Benjamin Franklin Elementary School. This was cause for cheer by an ecstatic Principal, Roslyn Sample Green and her faculty.



Our NCJW Volunteers registered similar excitement. In the third year of our volunteering our NCJW group has grown from 5 to 13 volunteers. Franklin is lacking in space for its 1000+ K thru

8th graders. Kindergarteners and first graders have no lunchroom nor playground for recess. What it does have is a staff committed to bringing a measure of joy and meaning to their students' formative years. They have adopted a skill-driven program, Positive Behavioral Incentive System, that focuses on developing children's sense of community, respect for others, and personal responsibility. The costs incurred are for staff training and handbooks, and rewards in the form of monthly student events such as ice cream dances and items delivered to classes on carts, earned by children's behavioral achievements. Our donations can help our adopted school in its life-long goals for their children.

Advocacy updates from Linda Lempert, Legislative Chair

Pennsylvania State Budget:

Apparently, HB1401, a bill introduced by state representative Gene Digirolamo of Bucks County to impose a severance tax of 3.2% on the shale gas industry did not pass the state legislature. Despite bi-partisan support (a majority of the state senate and many of the House

of Representatives were in favor of this bill), Mike Turzai, Speaker of the Pa House of Representatives) and Mike Reed, the House Majority Leader did not allow a vote. Passage of this bill is crucial to providing revenue to better fund education, health care, and other needs that affect the well-being of our communities. More advocacy information to come.

"Uprooted" Born in an internment camp for Japanese Americans, she fears Muslims face a similar fate.



Teresa Maebori's parents spent a year imprisoned at the Tule Lake concentration camp in California, with 19,000 other Japanese Americans, before they were sent to a farm labor camp in Idaho. Their daughter, Teresa, was born there in 1945. Teresa, a teacher for 36 years at Germantown Friends School, never forgot what her family endured and sees a similar situation of hate being experienced, in the anti-Muslim sentiment today.


