# A FAITH IN THE FUTURE A BELIEF IN ACTION® March 2017

Hundreds of thousands of women, as well as many men, joined the Women's March in Washington, D.C. on January 21 as well as sister marches in cities across the country to protest regressive proposals and inflammatory rhetoric and to support a progressive agenda which highlights women's rights and human rights. According to NCJW CEO, Nancy Kaufman, NCJW "was part of the messaging" and organized Jewish contingents in marches across the country.

When the JCRC was re-structured, the Interfaith Center was created soon thereafter to carry on this important work. Adam has been a member of the Religious Leaders Council Administrative Group for six years now, and he sees his involvement with the Interfaith Center as foundational to the JCRC's mission in our region.



Adam believes "that it's important for the Jewish community to be concerned about outreach and how we connect to the general community. The Jewish community, being only 2% of this country's population, should be concerned about parochialism - minority communities need to seek out friends across racial, cultural, and faith lines. As American citizens we need to connect on all kinds of issues that are not typically "Jewish issues" and work in coalition to solve our social ills."

## President's Message

Several years ago, the Drizin-Weiss Auxilliary No.215, Jewish War Veterans of the United States sponsored an essay contest entitled "What Being An American Means to Me." An 11 year old girl scout, Sandra Hoffman, won the contest with her essay entitled, "Thank God I Am An American." The following is an excerpt from the essay that was printed in her local newspaper.

In 1941 I was born in this free and wonderful country, America. Proper care was given to me at the hospital. At school I learned that no matter what my race or creed, I must respect and help others. I was able to go to synagogue, to attend public schools, go the the theaters, read the newspapers and know the truth of what is going on in the world. When our National Anthem is played, I'm proud to know that I'm an American with the rights to freedom of speech, freedom of worship, freedom of the press and freedom to respect the rights of one another. Thank God I'm an American.

Today and in the future, may our government be a democracy that will enable **all** children living here to feel the same freedom, security and love of country that this 11 year old girl felt so many years ago.


