In the wake of the mass shooting at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School, NC/W CEO Nancy Kaufman in a press release on February 15, 2018 stated that "the carnage and innocent deaths of children will not stop until ending gun violence becomes a litmus test issue for those running for office, and it is up to all of us to make that happen. NCIW will continue to do its part".

#### Updates on legislative news that impact all of us and the people we serve:

#### NEW ADVOCACY COMMITTEE FORMED



- Lynne Jacobs, our NCJW National Board Director and Pennsylvania Policy Advocate and I have notified all those who expressed interest in joining our new advocacy committee of our first meeting on April 27 2-4pm at the Abington Public Library, 1030 Old York Rd. Abington, PA
- One of our major tasks to be undertaken by our committee along with other coalition partners will be
  informing the general public of who their PA state and U.S. representative candidates are in the redrawn
  congressional districts. Note: Unlike your U.S. representatives your state reps and state senators' districts
  remain the same. Therefore, it is vital that voters are aware of the candidates for federal offices and who are the
  incumbents and challengers for seats in our state Senate and House.

### **BILLS TO FURTHER PROTECT DOMESTIC ABUSE VICTIMS**

This past week the Pennsylvania State Senate unanimously passed two bills that further protect victims of domestic violence: SB501 and SB 919. These two bills now move to the PA House for consideration.

SB 501 requires anyone under a PFA (Protection from Abuse Order) to surrender firearms to a sheriff or judge within 48 hours of receiving the PFA. The previous law which was much more lenient toward the abuser.

SB 919 allows victims of domestic abuse who live in public housing to be relocated to another unit to ensure their safety.

Please call your PA state senator to thank him/her for their bi-partisan effort to protect victims of domestic abuse.

### **EFFORTS TO COMBAT GERRYMANDERING IN PA**

There are two routes to counter partisan gerrymandering in Pennsylvania: one is through a lawsuit in the Pennsylvania state court system and the other is through amending the PA state constitution to be able to change the redistricting from the PA state legislature to a non-partisan citizens' committee, with no legislators permitted on this committee to redraw both congressional and PA state district lines.

While the lawsuit brought by the PA League of Women Voters has been successful, resulting in the new congressional districts being drawn, these new districts will only hold for the 2018 primary and November elections if the method of redrawing voting districts is not changed according to the PA state constitution before the 2020 census.

Please keep in mind that that the new congressional districts are only for the U.S. Congress, not the Pennsylvania state districts represented by our legislators in Harrisburg. Again, our state legislators' in Harrisburg voting district are still drawn by these same state legislators themselves.

Fair Districts PA an arm of the League of Women Voters of PA has been a non-partisan group that has endeavored to pass two bills in the PA state legislature **which would amend the state constitution to allow a non-legislative citizens' commission to redraw all districts on a more permanent basis after the2020 census.** Just a few days ago, HB722, which intended to establish a citizens commission to redraw both congressional and state districts, was completely gutted by a vote of the House state government committee to amend the original bill and which completely altered the wording of the bill. This amendment was passed on strictly partisan lines. There will most likely be many protest rallies.
