



ADVOCACY COMMITTEE OFF TO A GREAT START!!

In addition to working on voter registration and education, members of the Advocacy committee have continued their efforts to ensure that our federal courts, and especially the Supreme Court, have fair and independent judges. Our Benchmark Chair, Eleanor Levie, has been sending regular email alerts about NCJW's position on various judicial nominees. We ALL should be ready to call our Senators and make our feelings known. We have continued to work with the PA anti-trafficking coalition to pass the Safe Harbor bill that we've been promoting for almost two years. This bill would keep young trafficking victims out of the criminal justice system and help them get the services they need to turn their lives around. We plan to have one more lobby day in Harrisburg before this year's session ends and urge our legislators to do the right thing.

NCJW GREATER PHILADELPHIA SECTION was represented at the I0th birthday celebration of the Ronald McDonald House(RMH), by our member, Zelda Stern, who coordinates our volunteer program there. Our volunteers, on scheduled Sundays, come to RMH where they cook and serve tasty breakfasts to families who are staying there while their seriously ill children are treated at St. Christopher's Hospital.

The Ronald McDonald House, located at Front and Erie, was launched by a group of dedicated parents who had slept in hospital lobbies, their cars and ate from vending machines, to be near their children, often being great distances from their homes. It took an historic planning and fundraising effort. RMH has since served 3,358 seriously ill children from all 50 states, 3 U.S. territories and 44 countries. Besides breakfasts, our NCJW Section has provided clothing for families and new toys for the Ronald McDonald summer camp where ill children can enjoy the outdoors with their medical needs attended to.

We are privileged to support this exceptional facility and program.


