## SIGNS OF THE TIME



On Friday July 12th, 2019, Lights for Liberty: A Vigil to End Human Detention Camps, brought thousands of Americans into the streets, into their own front yards, and to detention camps across the country to protest the inhumane conditions faced by refugees. The message: Refugees, Asylum Seekers and Immigrants should be treated decently. No one should be put in detention centers. Especially not children.

## Co-President's Message

I am delighted to have as my co-president this year, Cindi Pasceri. Cindi and I have been working this past summer to address section plans and establish our NCJW priorities.



While we all are looking forward to the High Holidays, we must remember to continue to reflect on and assess this past year in our personal, professional and volunteer lives. So much has been happening in our country and, thank goodness, NCJW takes stands to try and change and advocate to improve lives impacted by what is going on. We have a lot of work to do... whether it is to prevent gun violence, protect the lives of refugees and immigrants at the borders, secure voting rights and protect our courts, and help our local community via our grants and community service.

Two years ago, when I became president, I had specific goals for our NCJW section. I am happy to say, that with the help of our wonderful Board of Directors, members and volunteers, we have been able to move our section forward in reaching these goals. No one person achieves goals and success on her own. It takes a motivated team working together to achieve what we have done. Let's look at our section's accomplishments below. I am only listing 10 but there are many more!

1. Increased our membership in all the surrounding counties to an all-time high....our publicity and public relations have been wonderful
2. Raised more money in Annual /Personal giving than ever before
3. Received a grant from the Kedson family foundation to provide cultural experiences to children who have never been exposed to the cultural arts
4. Sent 10 local members to the National NCJW Washington Institute, more women than ever before, resulting in new leaders as Board Directors and chairing and serving on Board committees
5. Our section was honored by HAMEC (Holocaust Awareness Museum Education Center) by receiving their Excellence in Education Award for supporting Holocaust education and volunteer service. I was honored to be their keynote speaker on behalf of our section.
6. Received a grant to create a new community service project as THE KIDS CLOSET, providing warm winter clothing for children
7. Created a Fund-Raising program to offer members the opportunity to sponsor our monthly and our twice-yearly programs and events
8. Our monthly Education/Program activities reached more participants than in previous years, resulting in an increase in membership.
9. An active Advocacy committee that expanded our Advocacy activities throughout the Greater Philadelphia Community
10. By raising more money for our section, we were able to increase our financial support for the Israel Granting Projects which will help all women, children and families in Israel.

Please help us continue our work together. Remember... "We are the National Council of Jewish Women, but we are for all people, regardless of religion, race, gender or sexual orientation". May you and NCJW go from Strength to Strength!

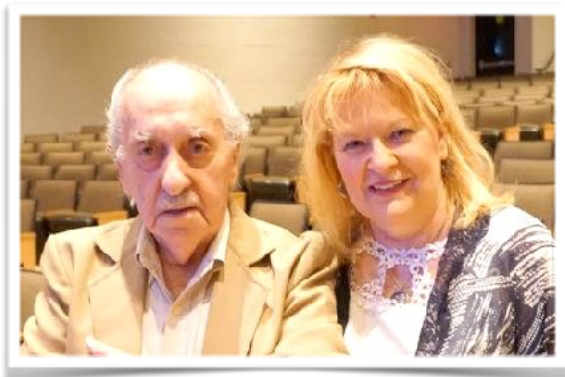


# NEVER FORGET - STUDENTS LEARN LESSONS OF THE HOLOCAUST

## An ALERT from our Advocacy Vice-President, Linda Lempert

HIASPA (Hebrew Immigration Aid Society of PA) has issued an alert because the Trump Administration has taken steps toward collapsing the refugee resettlement program, thus breaking our promise to the world. The administration is considering setting the refugee cap at zero this coming fiscal year.



The national movement to Rise Up for Refuge held a rally on Sunday, August 4 to demand that Congress:

1. Save the life-saving Refugee Resettlement Program
2. Stop the Asylum Band and Protect Asylum Seekers
3. Keep Families Together and End Child and Family Detention
4. Cut Funding that Fuels Deportation, Detention, Border Militarization
5. Protect Refugee and Immigrant Families from Prolonged Separation

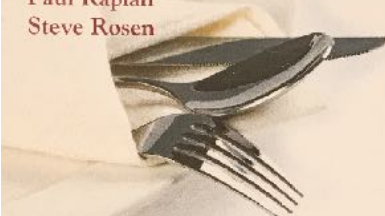
