

PENNSYLVANIA'S NEXT DECADE

——to be determined by January 24, 2022

In January, our State's bi-partisan Legislative Reapportionment Commission(LRC) will submit their redistricting maps for the next ten years. Their mission is to provide political equity. The resulting political maps will impact our representation on policies regarding Health Care, Jobs, the Environment, Education and more.


Much appreciation is owed to two organizations that have played leading roles on behalf of the public's interest, working against gerrymandering for political advantage: The League of Women Voters and Fair Votes, Pa. Their efforts have led to transparency with the LRC process and engagement of citizens to review and propose changes to map drafts. Testimony at LRC HEARINGS by Fair Districts Pa have shone a light on how gerrymandering has created underrepresentation of communities of color and barriers to reasonable physical access to elected representatives' offices.

What had begun last year with parents getting together to look for ways to safely reopen schools mushroomed into a Some parents wanted to maintain a singular focus on school reopening. Other parents, after experiencing the power of making gains with their initial cause, started branching out. There were rails against transgender use of bathrooms and unfounded accusations and denouncements of Critical Race Theory. Arriving at meetings, were groups of people supporting extremist diatribes, many thought to be from outside the district.

As expected, the local Jewish Community is horrified. Rabbi Sigal of Temple Judea in Doylestown convened a meeting with the Pennsylvania Peace Center and other groups concerned with social justice. Our NCJW SECTION'S ADVOCACY VICE PRESIDENT, Liz Downing, a Central Bucks County resident, is representing our NCJW SECTION. Holding a well-attended meeting on Zoom (100 participants), this coalition began to strategize a response to these devastating events, preparing for the next School Board meeting to be held on Monday, December 6 at 7:30 pm.


