We know that many in the Jewish community are looking for a way to help those who provide direct care. That's why we created the Jewish Fund for Abortion Access in partnership with the National Abortion Federation (NAF), a national organization that represents, serves, and supports abortion providers in delivering patient-centered, evidence-based care.

NAF is dedicated to ensuring individuals have the information and resources they need when they seek to terminate a pregnancy. The fund through NCJW will help with their emergency relief efforts in three ways:

- 1. Funding the largest hotline in the country, which will help individuals learn what they need based on where they live to access abortions. After reaching out to the hotline, the person calling is assigned a case manager who will help them through their journey.
- 2. Funding travel over state lines for those who need it.
- 3. Funding abortions at NAF approved clinics for those who need it.

A Petition for Bipartisanship

In the PA House and Senate, committee chairs elected by a tiny fraction of PA voters can block bills with strong bipartisan support. Legislative leaders can ignore bills passed with bipartisan support from committee or the other chamber. Mechanisms used in most other states to ensure bipartisan bills get a vote don't exist in the PA legislature.

Much-needed solutions, introduced session after session, never get a vote.

By any measure, Pennsylvania is one of the least effective, most expensive full-time legislatures in the country. In the average session, less than 7% of bills introduced get a final vote. Many of the bills that do pass just name bridges or roads. Meanwhile, issues of great importance to all PA voters stay locked in committee because committee chairs "aren't interested," or because their major donors prefer the status quo.

It's time to change this! It's time to fix the rules so bipartisan solutions can get a vote in Harrisburg. Until we fix this structural flaw in our legislative process, our legislators can never fully represent us.



Getting To Know More About You





Here's an extra treat. Last week, Pat stopped by our home and left us with some fabulous cookies. My husband, Mal asked her for the recipe and he's made them twice since. You can find the original recipe at https://www.loveandoliveoil.com/2020/08/confettiamaretti-cookies.html

Here's Mal's fast and easy version of **Confetti Amaretti Cookies**

- (Dry Ingredients)
- 2 1/4 cups (200g) almond flour
- 7/8 cup (175g) granulated sugar
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 cup confetti sequin sprinkles

- 2 large egg whites (about 65 grams)
- 1/4 teaspoon lemon juice
- ½ teaspoon almond extract

plus confectioners' sugar, as needed

Preheat oven to 300°

Stack two matching, heavyweight, light to medium colored cookie sheets one inside the other (stacking two cookie sheets together keeps the bottoms of the cookies from getting too brown). Line with parchment paper or a silicone baking mat.

Mix the dry ingredients together.

In the bowl of a stand mixer fitted with the whisk attachment, whisk egg whites and lemon juice until they hold soft peaks.

Whisk in ½ teaspoon almond extract

Replace the whisk with a bread hook, add the dry ingredients and combine everything.

Lightly dust your hands with powdered sugar.

Use a small cookie scoop to portion dough into 1-inch balls.

Roll into a smooth ball, then roll in powdered sugar.

Arrange on parchment or silicon-lined baking sheets, leaving 1 inch of space between cookies.

Bake for about 30 minutes until tops are cracked and bottoms are just barely golden (if you are NOT using doubled cookie sheets your cookies will brown much quicker, and will likely need less time, so watch them closely).
